UNICORN AUTHOR'S CLUB

The Unicorn Authors Club is a magical online sanctuary where authors of color (and allies who really mean it!) finish out gorgeous, urgently needed books. Founded by author Guiding Coach Minal Hajratwala and a small team amidst the multiple pandemics of 2020, we offer rigorous professional coaching, community support, and co-writing sessions to help writers complete book proposals and manuscripts. We work to liberate our writing process and our stories from white supremacy paradigms and develop strategies for writing through trauma, grief, and internalized oppressions. We have served more than 100 writers to date. Our writers have secured literary agent representation, won prestigious writing prizes, and signed book deals based on work they did in the Club. In 2022 we launched the Changemaker Authors Cohort in partnership with Narrative Initiative, partially resourced by the Ford Foundation, to support full-time movement activists and social justice practitioners to complete books that create durable narrative change.

Minal Hajratwala (they/she) is the founder and Guiding Coach of unicorn author's Club. She has been coaching authors since the 2009 publication of their first book, Leaving India: My Family's Journey From Five Villages to Five Continents, which was called "incomparable" by Alice Walker and "searingly honest" by the Washington Post. It won a Pen USA Award, an Asian American Writers Workshop Award, a Lambda Literary Award, and a California Book Award.

Minal spent seven years researching and writing the book that became Leaving India, traveling the world to interview more than 75 members of her extended family. The writing was often difficult, and in hindsight, those seven years were an intensive study of craft, writer's block, internalized oppression, and how to develop one's own supportive writing community. Since publishing Leaving India to critical acclaim, Minal has turned their knowledge and editorial expertise toward supporting other writers as a
